




<b>Changes</b>	Something that is obviously different from what occurred previously	<b>Primary Sources</b>	Is work that gives original information. Comes from a time being studied.
<b>Long ship</b>	Seagoing vessels made for trade, exploring and raiding	<b>Secondary Sources</b>	Does not give original information. Interprets or summarises information.
<b>Invasion</b>	An unwelcomes entrance into a country or region with an armed force	<b>Kingdom</b>	A kingdom is a piece of land that is ruled by a king or a queen.
<b>Norsemen</b>	Men of the North travelled by Longships	<b>Vikings</b>	The Vikings were warriors from northern Europe. They attacked many countries.
<b>Political</b>	How power is gained and used in a country	<b>Anglo-Saxons</b>	A group of farmer-warriors who lived in Britain over a thousand years ago. Made up of three tribes (Angle, Saxon and Jute)
<b>Interpretation</b>	The process by which we describe and evaluate an explanation of past events	<b>Concurrent</b>	Occurring at the same time
<b>Chiefs/warriors</b>	A fighter or soldier	<b>Development</b>	Improvement in the standard of living of people in a specific country
<b>Village life</b>	Vikings settled into communities alongside previous inhabitants	<b>Hierarchy</b>	Is a way of ranking and organizing things or people
